This is also the case in North America: where SCHÜTZ is taking a further step in expanding its market position by opening its first location in Canada.



SCHÜTZ OPENS FIRST PRODUCTION SITE IN CANADA

The new plant in Belleville, Ontario, is a clear commitment to all customers in the growing economic region. The area is particularly characterized by the chemical industry, food and cosmetics industry, automotive industry, and iron and steel processing.

Belleville is conveniently located between the metropolises of Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa, in the immediate vicinity of Lake Ontario. The city is part of the Quebec City-Windsor Corridor, which is the most





densely populated and industrially strongest region in the country. Numerous large international companies are located in the immediate vicinity of the new production site. With the new plant, SCHÜTZ is getting even closer to its customers: shorter distances, service and on-site contacts enable fast deliveries and maximum supply security.

The new Belleville location enables customers from Canada and the Northeast of the USA to have short transport routes, an extensive product range and maximum supply security.

On the site in Belleville, SCHÜTZ has completely refurbished and equipped a 20,000m² production building to be energy-efficient and state-of-the-art. A multi-layer extrusion blow moulding system for the production of IBC inner bottles, a complete IBC assembly line and a multilayer extrusion blow moulding system for the production of F1 220 litres plastic tight head drums were installed. Customers from the region can purchase IBCs and PE drums in a wide variety of designs. An important criterion in the choice of location was that the spacious area offers the opportunity for future expansion of production capacities and that it has its own railway siding. SCHÜTZ relies on rail transport, wherever possible, and the infrastructure at the Belleville site is designed so that raw materials can be delivered by "hopper cars", which
