



VIP visit: SCHÜTZ welcomes Michael L. Parson, the Governor of Missouri, to its site in Selters

On 26 July, company founder Udo Schütz and Veit Enders, Managing Director at SCHÜTZ, hosted the Governor of the US state of Missouri, Michael L. Parson, his wife Teresa N. Parson, and the delegation of Missouri state representatives.

As part of their trip to Europe, Governor Michael L. Parson, his wife and the delegation of representatives from Missouri visited the SCHÜTZ headquarters in Selters. At the meeting on 26 July, the American delegates were able to obtain a detailed impression of the comprehensive network of SCHÜTZ locations in North America. They also gained a detailed insight into current projects and future investment plans – with a particular focus on the St. Joseph site in Missouri. Over the years, the company from Selters has constantly strengthened its very good relationship with the local population in Missouri and with the political contacts in the region. The visit by Governor Parson and the Missouri delegation further underlined these existing contacts.

SCHÜTZ has had its own plant in Missouri since 2014. In the IBC production hall, the company has been manufacturing IBCs to the highest environmental and safety standards using state-of-the-art machinery since 2015. The St. Joseph site has been steadily expanded in recent years. In 2017, construction work began on a hall for IBC reconditioning and a building for drum production and storage. Since 2019, SCHÜTZ has been producing certified PE drums in Missouri and also reconditioning used IBCs based on the highest environmental, safety and quality management standards.



For 2022, SCHÜTZ plans to install another 6-layer extrusion blow-moulding line and to add the new ECOBULK MX 560 to its on-site product portfolio.
