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New production site in Vietnam:

SCHÜTZ strengthens supply security and presence in Southeast Asia

SCHÜTZ is further expanding its global network in Southeast Asia by opening a new plant in the Vietnamese port city of Phú Mỹ. As well as facilities for the production of IBCs and PE drums for the local market, the site also has its own steel components plant, which significantly boosts the supply security of key components for our plants throughout the region via Vietnam's largest container port.

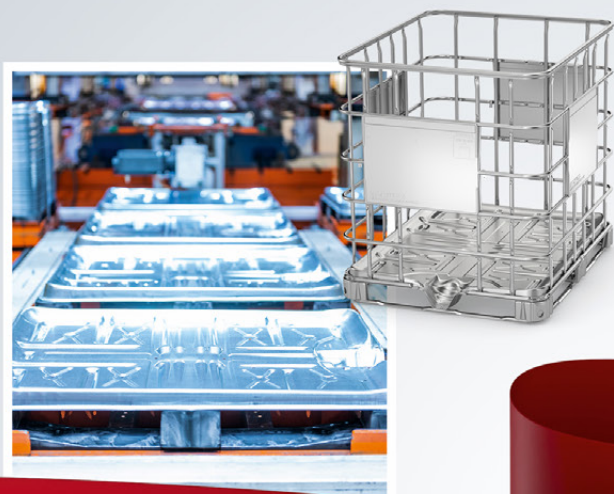
With the new SCHÜTZ plant in Phú Mỹ, Vietnam, we are steadily advancing our international growth strategy. Production began in July 2026, initially for the popular ECOBULK MX and SX 1000 IBC models, as well as the F1 220-litre tight-head drum. Being conveniently close to our customers has instant benefits: shorter transport routes and delivery times significantly reduce the carbon footprint along the entire supply chain.



In addition to state-of-the-art packaging production, the new SCHÜTZ facility features an integrated steel components plant – the second of its kind in the Asia-Pacific region. This allows us to pursue our strategy of using regional component hubs not only to ensure the continuous supply of materials and hence boost supply security for customers in the wider region, but also to further reduce the global footprint of our packaging systems.

Like all SCHÜTZ plants worldwide, the facility in Vietnam will be FSSC 22000 certified, meeting the highest international standards for quality and food safety. Our customers in this dynamic economic region now benefit from a wider choice of products from our innovative packaging portfolio.

The new SCHÜTZ facility in Phú Mỹ underscores our long-term commitment to the Asian market and lays the foundation for customer proximity, supply security and further growth in the region.



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
